- Support Nigerian development through “**credible**” management of projects

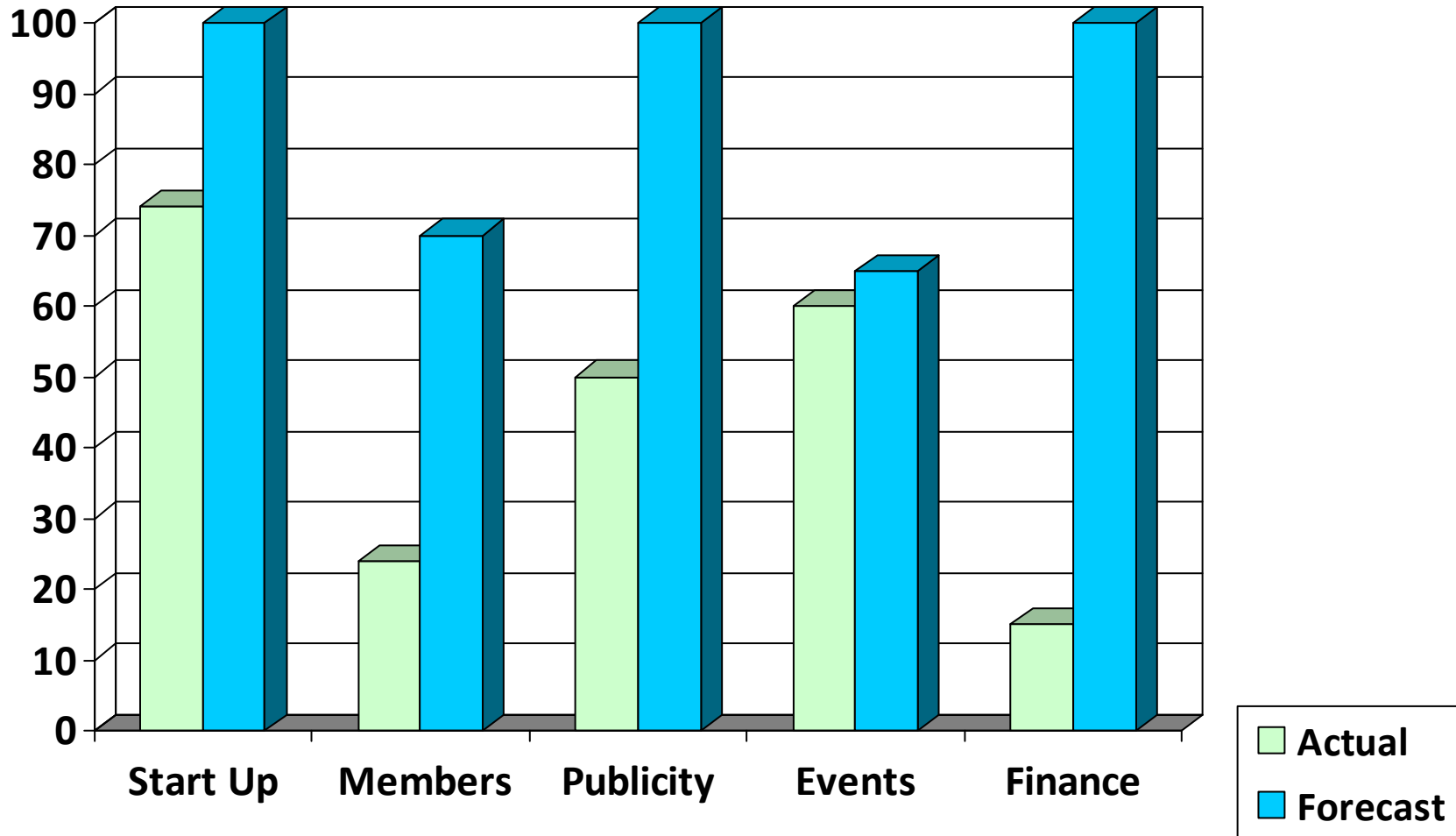
